Excerpts from the CHC Constitution and Bylaws printed for Adult Bible Study, 9 Nov 2008 CHURCH OF THE HOLY COMMUNION CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS Constitution Second This Church acknowledges itself to be a member of the Reformed Episcopal Church of the United States, hereinafter referred to as the "RE Church" and adopts as its form of worship the doctrine and worship of the RE Church as set forth in the Constitution and Canons of the said RE Church, except as is provided in Article Nine, hereof. Ninth The Church shall, at its sole option, retain absolute control of the following:

- Use of the 1928 Book of Common Prayer of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States of America, and…

Bylaws Article I Name and Purpose Section 2 The purpose of the Church is to conduct religious worship, education, training and ministry in accordance with the One, Catholic, Apostolic faith, specifically as expressed by the 1928 Book of Common Prayer of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States of America, which shall be in use at all services. The said 1928 Book of Common Prayer is hereby declared to be the standard book of common prayer for this Church. The ministers of the Church shall have, as their foundation, the belief in Jesus Christ as the Risen Son of the Living God and the adherence to the historic doctrines, traditions and worship practices of the Reformed Episcopal Church and the Anglican Communion.
